

ring who pioneered the separation of sewage and storm runoff waste forms the 1st sanitation department for NYC called the DEPARTMENT OF STREET CLEANING 1881

ting of 7 'hallujah lassies' led by Commissioner George Scott Railton sent to form the 1st permanent mission in the US, the SALVATION ARMY UNIT ARRIVES IN NEW YORK 1880

Despite a letter writing campaign by the children of London to Queen Victoria, the London Zoo accepted PT Barnum's \$10,000 for its elephant; on Easter Sunday, the 'Assyrian Monarch' landed at Pier A and JUMBO ARRIVED 1882

Over 500,000 people gathered for this spectacular citywide celebration featuring fireworks; thousands ate at the banquets at Delmonico's and Madison Square Gardens EVACUATION DAY CENTENNIAL 1883

Designed by Frédéric A Bartholdi & engineered by Gustave Eiffel in recognition of Franco-American friendship; President Grover Cleveland, presides over the October 29th opening of the STATUE OF LIBERTY 1886

An impromptu parade celebrating the opening of the Statue of Liberty with employees throwing 'ticker tape' out of windows to join in the celebration became the 1st of the 206 TICKER TAPE PARADES 1886

Norris G. Starkweather incorporated the most advanced fireproofing methods at the time including 40" thick brick walls and cast iron construction into his design for the POTTER BUILDING 1886

who went on to a spectacular career at the Ziegfeld Follies; Barbra Streisand's career was launched when she starred in Funny Girl which was based on her life FANNY BRICE BORN 1891

Workers from Kletzk, a Polish village formed the first of the 93 Polish benevolent societies listed in the neighborhood, the INDEPENDENT KLETZKER BROTHERLY AID SOCIETY 1892

Architect Bruce Price designed one of Manhattan's first buildings with steel framing and curtain wall construction and the city's 2nd tallest building for the AMERICAN SURETY COMPANY 1896

420 people died, mostly in tenements. President Roosevelt distributed free ice. People slept in city parks and temperatures remained over 90 degrees for 9 days in the HEAT WAVE OF 1896 1896

Records dating from 1840 were destroyed and the station is relocated to the harge office in Battery Park after a fire where the new ELLIS ISLAND IMMIGRATION STATION BURNS DOWN 1897

es caused by the 2.5 million lbs of manure daily and 60,000 gallons of urine from the City's more than 100,000 animals led to the FIRST INTERNATIONAL URBAN PLANNING CONFERENCE 1898

In response to The City Beautiful Movement, NY established a commission to regulate public art and architecture now known as the Public Design Commission but originally the MUNICIPAL ART COMMISSION 1898

Lillian Wald and Charles Stover founded a playground and recreation advocacy group built the park as the first permanent, municipally built playground in the United States OUTDOOR RECREATION LEAGUE 1902

Unhappy with his 1893 sculpture, artist Jonathan Scott Hartley resculpted Swedish American engineer and inventor who helped to revolutionize military-maritime technology with his ironclad warship, the Monitor JOHN ERICSSON 1903

the 'General Map of the City of New York' measuring 27 ft. x³¹ ft., the largest of an American city every executed and completed in 6 months - was unveiled at the Paris Exposition of 1900 by Chief Engineer of NY City's Topographical Bureau LOUIS ALOYS RISSE **1900**

The Post Office begins sending mail from the Produce Exchange on Bowling Green to the Old General Post Office on Park Row, a distance of 3750 ft through a leased PNEUMATIC TUBE 1897

Capitalized at \$1.5 billion, the largest steel company and the largest business enterprise ever launched by JP Morgan was founded as UNITED STATES STEEL CORPORATION 1901

In response to McKinley's assassination, the government passed a law to exclude potential immigrants because of their political beliefs THE ANARCHIST EXCLUSION ACT 1903

Opening a few months after a major fire, Chief engineer Leffert L. Buck and architect Henry Hornbostel designed the \$24 million WILLIAMSBURG SUSPENSION BRIDGE 1903

After the immigration to Castle Garden ends, Annie Moore is the first immigrant processed of nearly 450,000 people who arrived that year FEDERAL IMMIGRATION CENTER OPENS AT ELLIS ISLAND 1892

urst's City Vigilant League precipitated NY State to appoint State Senator Clarence Lexow to hold extensive hearings about corruption in the Police Department which eventually led to the downfall of Tammany Hall LEXOW COMMITTEE 1894 Formed after a mass meeting at Madison Square Garden as a 'citizens movement outside of party politics' to elect a reform mayor - Chaired by Joseph Laroque former Bar Association President COMMITTEE OF SEVENTY 1894

dwin Bissell's sculpture of the early Dutch Mayor, alderman, acting governor and member of the King's Council who among other things donated the land for the original City Hall ABRAHAM DE PEYSTER STATUE DEDICATED 1896

One of the earliest facilities to provide immigrants with citizenship lessons, English instruction and innovations like kindergartens and public baths was the UNIVERSITY SETTLEMENT HOUSE **1886**

idge in the world, spanning 1596 ft. After Engineer John Roebling and son Washington were injured, daughter-in-law Emily Robling completed the Bridge; 1,800 vehicles and 150,300 people crossed the first day that the BROOKLYN BRIDGE OPENS 1883

As part of Joseph Pulitzer's fundraising campaign for the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty; \$100,000 was raised in 6 months - considered by many to be the 'first Kickstarter' campaign was a poem by Emma Lazarus THE 'NEW COLOSSUS' 1883

Architect Bradford Gilbert designed the 1st building provide young men with shelter as an alternative to the overcrowded flophouse accommodations that dominated the Bowery for the YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION 1885

settlement house founded to 'Americanize' Eastern European Jews. Yiddish was banned. By 1903 10,000 people a day used its Rooftop Garden as a 'Tar Beach' and both Sholem Aleichem and Mark Twain spoke at the EDUCATIONAL ALLIANCE 1889

movies and has the distinction of being the last elevated line to close in Manhattan in 1955 IRT THIRD AVENUE ELEVATED LINE 1878

itectural practice which would grow into the largest firm in the country completing about 1000 buildings MCKIM MEAD AND WHITE 1879

To provide district steam heat for 1700 buildings in lower Manhattan, New York Steam Company 1ST NEW YORK STEAM PLANT 1881

Cass Gilbert organizes a group of 26 young architects to further their education in the profession as the ARCHITECTURAL LEAGUE **1881**

Chinese restricted, as well as "lunatics" and "idiots" prevented from entering the country NY the THE CHINESE EXCLUSION ACT 1882

ew Garvey, the 'Prince of Plasterers', was paid \$133,187 for two days' work on the courtroom window frames for the TWEED COURTHOUSE 1881

1st central generating station built at the Edison Illuminating Company to supply the first 59 customers from dynamos at the PEARL STREET STATION 1882

Union leaders led 500 newly arrived Jewish immigrants to urge them not to work as scabs during the Longshoreman's Strike at EISLER'S GOLDEN RULE HALL 1882

To celebrate union memberships 30,000 workers gave up a day's pay to march from City Hall to Union Square on September 5th in the 1ST LABOR DAY PARADE 1882

Founded as one of the earliest community organizations in the Chinese community was the CHINESE CONSOLIDATED BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION 1883

Every political figure of significance had their photo taken by Matthew Brady at BRADY'S NATIONAL GALLERY OF DAGUERREOTYPES **1844**

Enormous 144'x220'x60' metal-framed trading hall was a precursor to skyscraper 'cage construction' at the NEW YORK PRODUCE EXCHANGE 1884

New York Tribune used a new type of press for the 1st time to print its newspaper OTTMAR MERGENTHALER'S LINOTYPE MACHINE **1886**

After losing the election of 1888 to Benjamin Harrison, Grover Cleveland accepted a job at BANGS STETSON TRACY AND MACVEIGH 1888

Samuel F O'Reilly adapted Thomas Edison's electric engraving pen to draw designs in skin at his barbershop TATTOOING INVENTED 1891

After a fiery speech, Anarchist Emma Goldman led thousands of unemployed New Yorkers who started a RIOT AT WALHALLA HALL 1893

Lillian Wald started the first non-profit for social & health services on the Lower East Side HENRY STREET SETTLEMENT 1893

Architects Kimball & Thompson design the tallest building in the world at 348 ft. for the MANHATTAN LIFE INSURANCE CO. 1894

Architect Stanford White designed one of the first classically inspired banks for the BOWERY SAVINGS BANK 1894

Appointed to rid the Police Department of vice TEDDY ROOSEVELT BECOMES POLICE COMMISSIONER 1895

The city's most popular attraction for the past 45 years becomes NEW YORK AQUARIUM AT CASTLE GARDEN **1896**

The 1st full service pizzeria in America was started in GENNARO LOMBARDI'S GROCERY STORE 1897

A group of 50 Yiddish speaking socialists published the JEWISH DAILY NEWSPAPER FORWARD **1897**

IRT service ran from City Hall to Grand Central when the 1ST SECTION OF NY SUBWAY OPENED 1900

2251 people are processed on first day on Ellis Island at the NEW FIREPROOF IMMIGRATION CENTER 1903

Now carrying over 22 million passengers annually, the City takes over the operations of the STATEN ISLAND FERRY **1905**

the 1st space cooled with air conditioning was the TRADING FLOOR OF THE NY STOCK EXCHANGE **1903**

Consistently ranked among the top public schools in the US, STUYVESANT HIGH SCHOOL FOUNDED **1904**

The Clinton & Russell building became the new headquarters of the MUNSON STEAMSHIP COMPANY 1904

in Little Syria, NY's first community of Middle Eastern immigrants LINOTYPE MACHINE IS MODIFIED TO PRODUCE ARABIC CHARACTERS 1892

Considered by some to be America's first espresso bar, a pastry shop for opera lovers seeking 'likeminded company and refreshments' opened, CAFÉ FERRARA 1892

Onboard the Presidential Yacht Oneida, five doctors and a dentist surreptitiously removed a cancerous growth from the jaw of PRESIDENT CLEVELAND 1893

purchased the NY Journal which began publishing sensational crime and sex stories as he built his newspaper chain rivalling Pulitzers WILLIAM RANDOLPH HEARST **1895**

To thank the Department of Sanitation workers for cleaning the city streets in 16 months, George Waring organized the SANITATION WORKER PARADE 1896

On Sept 21, an editorial in the NY Sun assures letter writer 8-year old Virginia O'Hanlon that YES, VIRGINIA, THERE IS A SANTA CLAUS **1897**

The five boroughs consolidated their combined population of 3.5M creating the world's 2nd largest city after London into GREATER NEW YORK 1898

RH Robertson designed one of the city's first commercial skyscrapers at 391 ft tall which held the record for nearly a decade. PARK ROW BUILDING 1899

Inaugurated as the youngest US president in history following McKinley's assassination, TEDDY ROOSEVELT ELECTED US PRESIDENT 1900

Named after former Secretary of State William Henry Seward who was most noted for the purchase of Alaska 'Seward's Folly' SEWARD PARK 1902

Largest, most valuable office building in Manhattan with state-of-the-art technology at its completion BROAD EXCHANGE BUILDING 1902

On Friday night Mayor McClellan inaugurated the first subway; more than 125,000 people took a ride before midnight CITY HALL STATION 1904

Embedded in the sidewalk for an advertising campaign and repaired in 1983 by Cartier was BARTHMAN'S JEWELERS CLOCK 1899

NYSE closes for the 1st time, 200 people die & demands for a subway system occur after the GREAT BLIZZARD OF 1888 **1888**

1st daily publication dedicated to printing stock tables & company finance information THE WALL STREET JOURNAL **1889** Joseph Pulitzer's New York World sponsors a 72 day trip around the world featuring daily reports filed by telegraph by NELLIE BLY 1889

A prominent humor magazine moved to New York and began publishing PUCK MAGAZINE **1876**

1st mains installed by Edison Illuminating Company for STREET ELECTRICITY LINES 1881

1st index to measure the activity of the N.Y.S.E. was designed by DOW JONES & COMPANY **1882**

Installed on the Brooklyn Bridge were the 1ST PUBLICLY OPERATED CABLE POWERED LINES 1883

The failure of the brokerage firm of (Buck) Grant (son of Ulysses) and Ward led to the PANIC OF 1884 **1884**

The Edison Illuminated Company and several others combined into CON EDISON 1884

The Waste treatment plant on Governors Island was the 1ST INCINERATOR IN THE US 1885

Oldest clubhouse built and still occupied by its members in NY DOWN TOWN ASSOCIATION **1887**

Jews of Eastern Europe open their 1st synagogue in America ELDRIDGE STREET SYNAGOGUE **1887**

Jacob August Riis exposed slum housing in his photographic expose HOW THE OTHER HALF LIVES **1890** with the bicycle boom of the 1890's, Western Union employs NY's first BICYCLE MESSENGERS **1890**

1st recreational organization in NY State founded as the NY SOCIETY FOR PARKS & PLAYGROUNDS **1891**

Marcellus Flemming Berry working for American Express invents the TRAVELERS CHEOUE 1891

NY City creates a separate department known as the DEPARTMENT OF BUILDINGS 1892

Index established for the stock market DOW JONES INDUSTRIAL AVERAGE 1896

by John Quincy Adams Ward was installed for the Centennial of Washington's inauguration GEORGE WASHINGTON **1883**

J D Rockefeller moved its headquarters to New York from Ohio and builds a building at Bowling Green for STANDARD OIL 1885

1st customer of New York Steam UNITED BANK BUILDING 1882
